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NEWS FROM ASSESSOR Kim Anderson, CIAO

Earlier this year our State Legislature passed SB 1975 which is now Public Act 102-895 in an effort to lower property tax bills. What the public act did was raise the amount of two exemptions. The general homestead exemption previously removed \$6,000 from the assessed value of residential properties and will now remove \$8,000. The general senior homestead exemption previously removed \$5,000 from the assessed value and will now remove \$8,000. This will not be seen until your 2024 property tax bill. All available exemptions along with their descriptions can be found on our website at www.troytownship.com under the assessor tab – exemptions. Please take the time to review your property tax bill to ensure that you are receiving all exemptions you are entitled to. If you notice something missing, please contact Will County Supervisor of Assessments immediately at 815-740-4648. As always, if you need any assistance in completing applications for any exemption, please feel free to contact us or stop in. Our office is open 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday.

As I am sure everyone is aware the market value of residential properties has been significantly increasing nationwide over the last couple of years and we are no exception. Troy Township residential properties saw an increase in value just shy of six and half percent for 2022. The increase factors were published for all Will County townships in the Joliet Herald News along with any reassessments on August 10th and 11th.

Throughout the year you may see our field staff out and about in your neighborhood. They can be identified by our township vehicle, a silver Ford Explorer with our logo on the side. The field staff will have lanyards around their necks with their picture on them and wear clothing with our Troy Townships logo. There are many reasons they are out field checking. If you add and/or remove an improvement, if anyone questions something that doesn't look right with regards to the property, or we have been contacted by the property owner. Please keep in mind if you remove something from your property like an in-ground swimming pool, deck, or patio, etc. you should contact us so we may remove it from your properties assessment if you did not obtain a permit.

As always, please review your property information either online on our website at www.troytownship. com under the assessor tab – property search or you may contact us. It is very important that we have the correct information listed on your property record card to insure we have the correct value. Please note that the search function is very sensitive to address searches. Please only enter a street name then hit enter or the "search data" button. A list of addresses will show up, you can then choose the house number you are looking for. Please note: our website is under constant updating, if you cannot find what you are looking for, please call or email us.


SHREDDING EVENT AND MEDICATION DISPOSAL OCTOBER 1ST



Join us on Saturday, October 1, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. when Troy Township will host its next shredding and medication disposal event. This event will take place at 25448 Seil Road in Shorewood. Troy Township residents can bring their personal papers and documents to the township parking lot on the west side of the township offices and community center to be shredded onsite by Iron Mountain. Each resident must show proof of township residency and are allowed no more than 4 grocery bags of paper per vehicle to be shredded.

The event will end early due to inclement weather, if the shredding truck fills up or may be cancelled due to COVID Restrictions

Troy Township is proud to once again partner with the Shorewood Police Department to be offer medication disposal only at the shredding event. Township residents can bring their unneeded medication so that it can be disposed of properly. **Make sure to bring only residentially generated medication items. No medications from businesses or doctor's offices will be accepted.** Use a permanent marker to black out your name or personal information on the label or you may empty all your pills into a Ziplock bag and bring that.

A MESSAGE FROM HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER Thomas R. Ward

I would like to begin by acknowledging our Township Highway Department crew members. They have been staying very busy and working very hard to keep up with the work within the township this summer. If a job has been scheduled in front of your property, please be patient as we will be there as soon as we can.

As I mentioned in the Spring 2022 newsletter, there has been a significant number of infrastructure improvement projects in the Troy Township area happening this year and in the very near future. We are currently in Phase 1 engineering for the replacement and relocation of the Shepley Road Bridge over the DuPage River. The cost of which is significant. For that reason, our available budget funds for larger resurfacing projects in the next year or so will be tight.

Rest assured all road conditions will be monitored by our office and repairs made when needed.

That being said, I'd like to thank State Representative Larry Walsh, Jr. for his efforts to help us secure grants for future capital improvement projects. State Representative Walsh, Jr. is always readily available for any questions or concerns I have about township affairs.

With winter coming up please be careful driving on wet, snowy, and icy roads. The salt is not effective in open areas of blowing and drifting snow and not effective once temperatures drop below 25 degrees.

SERVICES FOR UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF TROY TOWNSHIP

LEAF VACUUMING



Starting the middle of October through November (specific dates are weather dependent), Troy Township Highway Department will have the leaf vacuuming service for residents in the **unincorporated** areas of the Township.

Please do not bag the leaves. Residents must rake leaves to the edge of the street so the vacuum machine can reach them easily. Do not place leaves in ditches as the vacuum cannot reach leaves in ditch areas. Grass cuttings will not be picked up as we have no way of disposing them. Please be advised that the leaf vacuuming service may be put on hold with the occurrence of a snow or ice event.

beginning of May 2023 on the first and third Monday of each month. For more information, please visit www.troytownship.com.


WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER

Troy Township has partnered with State Representative Larry Walsh, Jr. to bring the Secretary of State Mobile Driver Services Unit and I-Cash to the Troy Township Community Center on Tuesday, October 4, 2022. The Community Center is located at 25448 Seil Road, in Shorewood, Illinois. Illinois residents will be able to renew their driver's licenses (NO behind the wheel driving or written test will be offered), obtain duplicate or corrected licenses and obtain Illinois identification cards between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. REAL ID's can ONLY be issued at a Secretary of State facility and NOT at the mobile driver services unit event.

A Rules of the Road Review Course is tentatively scheduled to be held from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. The review course combines an explanation of safe driving techniques, Illinois driving laws and a practice written exam. If you want to participate in the Rules of the Road Review Course, please call 815-744-1963 to pre-register.

Common types of unclaimed property include: checking and savings accounts, uncashed wage and payroll checks, uncashed stock dividends

checking and savings accounts, uncashed wage and payroll checks, uncashed stock dividends and stock certificates, insurance payments, utility deposits, customer deposits, accounts payable, credit balances, refund checks, money orders, traveler's checks, mineral proceeds, court deposits, uncashed death benefit checks and life insurance proceeds. Unclaimed property does not include real estate or vehicles.

A representative from I-Cash will be assisting those interested in finding out if they have any unclaimed property.


